## What You Need to Know

### What to Bring

Bible, pencil, bedsheets, blanket, pillow, toilet articles, towels and washcloths, spending money, swimsuit, a ball glove, musical instrument or camera if you desire. NOTE: Items left at camp are kept for claiming as long as we have the space and then disposed of.

### What NOT to Bring

No penknives, iPods, MP3's, portable CD and/or tape systems and/or music recording/playing devices or TV's, for any reason. No tobacco, drugs or alcoholic beverages. No toys, bar bells, No immodest clothing (shorts permitted). No skate boards/roller blades. No cell phones/or 2-way radio units. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

### Dress Code

Both boys and girls should plan to dress nicely for evening meal and vesper service which follows. In swimming, if modesty is questioned, you should have a dark T-shirt to wear over your swimsuit. During recreation and other times, shorts and other casual type clothing are in order, provided they are of modest nature. Shoes must always be worn to the pool and in the dining hall. Modest Christian attire is to be the rule at camp, in and out of the swimming pool. No bare midriff or halter type clothing. Cut-off jeans, bikini and cut-out swimsuits are not permitted in the pool. No "bike pants" or other excessively tight-fitting clothing may be worn.

### The Rules

It is expected that Christian rules of conduct shall govern all the activities of the camp. A few statements may be made to avoid misunderstandings. Additional rules are listed in the CAMPER'S GUIDE BOOK.

1. Use of tobacco, drugs or alcoholic beverages is strictly forbidden.
2. Each person must live up to the camp schedule.
3. Permission of the Camp Manager or Deans must be given before anyone may leave the camp grounds. A camper may not leave the campus for outside social activities once they reach Camp Christian. Any exceptions must be approved jointly by the Dean and Camp Manager.
4. Automobiles will not be necessary in connection with camp activities. Campers who bring their automobiles must turn the keys into the office.
5. Report all cases of illness or injury to the camp nurse immediately.
6. If it is necessary to be absent from any class, report to the teacher in charge and secure permission.
7. Misconduct or intentional damage of camp property may result in the camper being restricted in privileges or being sent home on the hour without a refund of money.

### Visitors Are Welcome

All visitors should register with the Camp Manager immediately upon arrival and secure his permission to be on campus. You will be expected to pay for your meals and other costs. (You should make arrangements in advance for meals.) You will be expected to abide by the camp rules and not interfere with the schedule. The camp grounds are not open to the public when the camp program is in session. Due to curfew hour for the campers and faculty, visitors will be asked to leave the camp grounds before 10:00 p.m. during regular full week programs.

Parents, to keep home-sickness to a minimum, we do not encourage you to call or visit your child if he or she is prone to home-sickness.

FACULTY CHILDREN: Children who accompany camp deans, nurses, teachers, and other staff will be charged as follows: up to 5 years - \$25; 6-12 years - \$45; 13 and over - \$60. If camper age, regular tuition will be charged. Maximum per family, unless child is of camper age, - \$75.

NOTE: To accommodate occasional visitors and mobile campers, a minimum charge of \$6.00 will be made for additional meals.

1. You must register for your own age group; please don't ask us to make exceptions. You may attend only the week or weeks of camp that correspond with the grade that you will be entering in the Fall school term.
2. Registration cards are enclosed in this brochure. Fill out the card completely. PLEASE PRINT!! Campers who plan to attend more than one program must submit a separate registration form for each. Only one camper and one program per registration form.

4. Early Pre-registration discount is June 1. All youth campers of full weeks who register on or before June 1, will receive a \$10 discount. Be sure that you, your minister or church registrar mails your card early.
5. All campers will receive a free group picture.
6. Adult programs - Adults are asked to register no less than 10 days prior to their respective program/late fee applicable.

*Arrival & Departure*

1. Check-in time for REGULAR weeks of camp and FIRST CHANCE weeks, begin at 3:00 p.m. on Sundays.
2. All REGULAR weeks of camp will end on FRIDAY evening at 6:00.
3. FIRST CHANCE CAMP ends on Tuesday evenings at 6:00.
4. DAY CAMP & OVERNIGHTERS check-in time is 9:00 a.m. and ends at 5:30 p.m.
5. COLLEGE AGE RETREAT begins Thursday at 6:30 p.m. and ends Sunday at 11:00 a.m.

*Store Cards*

At the time of registration, Junior age campers and under are requested to purchase STORE CARDS to be used at the store rather than money. Any unused balance will be refunded at the end of the week. PARENTS - Extra money SHOULD NOT be left with campers who are under junior high age. \*Camp Christian accepts no responsibility for the camper's lost or stolen money.

*Insurance*

Camp Christian will provide a co-insurance program for injuries sustained by a camper while at camp. The family or individual coverage is the primary coverage for accidents and injuries. The Camp Policy will pay costs not covered by the primary individual's policy to the limit of the Camp's policy. Parents must list their Insurance Company and Policy number on the Registration Card.

*Mission Offerings*

During most programs, a missionary offering will be received. The campers are thus taught to share and to be interested in others. The entire mission offering goes to the mission project announced each week.

*Cancellation or Transfers*

If you find that you are unable to attend after you have sent in your registration, please contact Camp Christian so we can arrange for another camper to fill your place. NO refunds will be given for "NO SHOWS."
